A long time ago, people began to keep some kind of animals as pets and others for food and clothing. One of these animals was one sheep. People first began keeping sheep 7,000 years ago for their meat, milk and skin. There are about two hundred kinds of sheep found in Asia and Europe. Some of these can be found in our country. They include the Merino sheep which gives us wool and meat and the Maasai sheep mainly kept for meat. The merino sheep was first bred in Spain. It is quite small. It has a white face and white legs. Most of its body is covered with thick so wool. The rams have large horns but the ewes have no horns.

The black headed sheep came from Somalia. It has a black head and neck while the rest of the body is white in colour. It is small with a fat tail and long legs. It has no horns.

The Maasai sheep is usually brown and is larger than the merino and black-headed sheep. It is light and can move around very fast. The maasai usually keep it for meat. Although sheep are different in size, colour and the length of their wool, they all behave in almost the same way.
